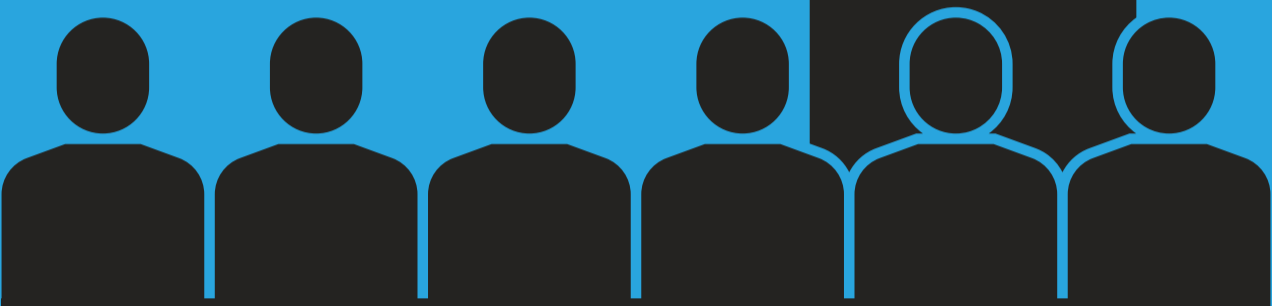


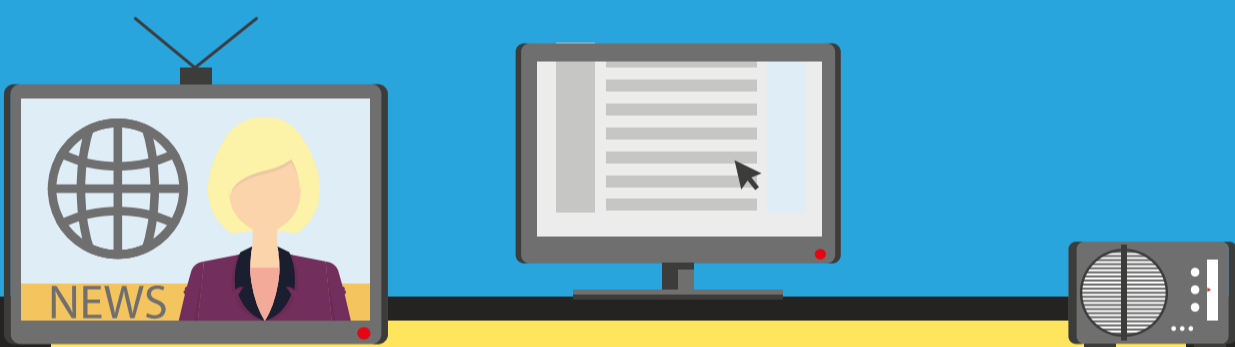
ADDRESSING THE WEAKNESSES OF JOURNALISM EDUCATION IN SEE

- Lack of quality practical education and traineeship programs.
- Few university lecturers have professional journalism experience.
- Shortage of modern equipment in state universities.
- Shortage of experienced, renowned professors in private universities.
- Lack of up-to-date text books and literature.
- Gap between university theory and the reality.



SOLUTIONS?

- Develop practical training (in courses, internships and media specialisations).
- Increase theoretical knowledge.
- Include ethics in each semester.
- Develop research projects for students to perfect their reading and writing skills.
- Include investigative journalism and media literacy in the curricula.
- Introduce the study of new media: operation, use and administration.
- Develop cooperation between universities and the media.
- Modernise textbook and literature, to correspond to current trends in journalism
